The course focuses on

- listening
- looking (including awareness of facial expression and body language)
- turn taking
- sharing
- appropriateness
- emotional literacy
- problem solving

The course is based on the Sulp (Social Use of Language programme).

It is appropriate for children who have, or are at risk of having difficulties making and keeping friends and also those who are unsettled or unfocused learners who have difficulty with concentration.

Also for children who are seen as bullies or are bullied.

The course is designed so that children can practise their new skills in a supportive environment away from their home and school context.

Usually children who fail in school can succeed here.

Led by a Specialist Teacher and a Speech and Language Therapist.

Important: *in very rare instances, it can become clear to the tutors during the course that a child/student is unlikely to benefit and/or may make it difficult for others to do so. If this should occur, we will require the child/student to be withdrawn from the course and a proportional refund of the fee will be made.*
